
Are you looking for direct flights from Florida to Paris?


Are you looking for direct flights from Los Angeles to Paris?

Arrival in Paris Charles De Gaulle Airport



Once you arrive in Paris CDG Airport, you have two convenient options for onward travel to Bordeaux:

01. TGV (Train à Grande Vitesse)

These high-speed trains in France can reach speeds of 320 km/h.

You can book your tickets on the **SNCF website** and arrive at Bordeaux Gare St Jean in just 3.5 hours.

02. Flight with Air France

Known for competitive rates and excellent service, <u>Air France</u> offers affordable options compared to other airlines. You'll enjoy a comfortable journey and reach Bordeaux Airport in less than 1.5 hours, making it a quick and convenient choice for your travel plans.



Arrival in Paris - Orly Airport



Train Options (TGV):

Once you arrive at Orly Airport, you can take the <u>Orlybus</u> to Denfert-Rochereau. From there, hop on Metro Line 6 (Direction Charles de Gaulle-Étoile) to reach <u>Gare Montparnasse-Bienvenüe.</u>

Once at Gare Montparnasse, you'll board a TGV train to Bordeaux, which typically takes around 3.5 hours to reach Bordeaux. Book your tickets in advance on the **SNCF website**.

Flight options:

There are no direct flights operating from Paris Orly Airport to Bordeaux Merignac Airport.





London Gatwick Airport (LGW)

Airline: <u>British Airways (BA)</u> provides direct flights from LGW to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD).

<u>EasyJet Airlines (EZY)</u> provides direct flights from LGW to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD)

Amsterdam Schiphol Airport (AMS)

Airline: <u>KLM Airlines (KL)</u> operates direct flights from AMS to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD).

Madrid Barajas Airport (MAD)

Airline: <u>Iberia Airlines (IB)</u> offers direct flights from MAD to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD).



Key Airports and Budget Airlines to Bordeaux



Paris Orly Airport (ORY)

Airlines: <u>Easy Jet (EZY)</u> operates flights from ORY to Nice Côte d'Azur Airport. From there you can catch a direct flight to Bordeaux-Merignac Airport(BOD)

Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport (CDG)

Airline: <u>Air France (AF)</u> operates direct flights from CDG to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD).

London Heathrow Airport (LHR)

Airline: <u>Air France (AF)</u> operates flights from LHR to Paris CDG. From there you can take a direct flight to Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD).



Train Options to Bordeaux from Connecting Cities:



From Paris Orly Airport (ORY)

Step 1: Take the Orlyval light rail to Antony Station.

Step 2: Transfer to an RER B train to Paris Gare Du Nord

Step 3: From Gare Du Nord, take a metro (Line 4) to Gare Montparnesse

Step 3: From Gare Montparnasse, take a <u>TGV</u> (high-speed train) to <u>Bordeaux-Saint-Jean Station</u>.

Duration: Total travel time approximately 3-4 hours.

From Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport (CDG)

Step 1: Take a <u>TGV</u> (high-speed train) directly from CDG TGV Station to <u>Bordeaux-Saint-Jean</u> Station. Duration: Approximately 3.5 hours.

From London Heathrow Airport (LHR)

Step 1: Take the **Heathrow Express** to London Paddington.

Step 2: Take the **Eurostar** from London St Pancras International to Paris Gare du Nord.

Step 3: Transfer to Paris Gare Montparnasse and take a TGV to Bordeaux-Saint-Jean Station.

Duration: Total travel time approximately 6-7 hours.



Train Options to Bordeaux from Connecting Cities:



From London Gatwick Airport (LGW)

Step 1: Take a train to London St Pancras International.

Step 2: Take the **Eurostar** from London St Pancras International to Paris Gare du Nord.

Step 3: Transfer to Paris Gare Montparnasse and take a TGV to Bordeaux-Saint-Jean Station.

Duration: Total travel time approximately 6-7 hours.

From Amsterdam Schiphol Airport (AMS)

Step 1: Take a **Thalys** or Intercity train from Amsterdam to Paris Gare du Nord.

Step 2: Transfer to Paris Gare Montparnasse and take a TGV to Bordeaux-Saint-Jean Station.

Duration: Total travel time approximately 6-7 hours.

From Madrid Barajas Airport (MAD)

Step 1: Take a train from Madrid Chamartín Station to San Sébastian-Donostia.

Step 2: Transfer to a TGV from San Sébastian-Donostia to Hendaye

Step 3: From Hendaye, take a train to Bordeaux-Saint-Jean Station.

Duration: Total travel time approximately 8-9 hours.

Travel to France With Your Medical Cannabis Prescription

Navigating the regulations for traveling with medical cannabis can be complex. Here are the key points to ensure a smooth journey:

Entering France with Medical Cannabis

Prescription Requirement:

- You must have a valid prescription from a healthcare provider.
- The prescription should be in your name and specify the medication and dosage.

European Union (EU) Rules:

- If you are traveling within the EU, the Schengen Agreement allows for the recognition of medical prescriptions across member states.
- Each country, however, has its own regulations regarding medical cannabis.

Quantity Limit:

• You can only carry the amount of medical cannabis necessary for your personal use for the duration of your stay, as specified in your prescription.

Documentation:

- Carry all relevant documentation, including:
- A copy of your prescription
- A letter from your prescribing doctor detailing your medical condition and the necessity of the medication
- Proof of identity (e.g., passport)

Customs Declaration:

• Declare the medical cannabis upon arrival at customs. Failure to do so can result in penalties or confiscation of the medication.







Travel to France With Your Medical Cannabis Prescription

Leaving France with Medical Cannabis

Prescription and Documentation:

• Similar to entering France, you must have a valid prescription and all necessary documentation.

Destination Country Rules:

- Check the regulations of the country you are traveling to, as laws regarding medical cannabis vary significantly between countries.
- Some countries have strict prohibitions against cannabis, even for medical use.

Customs Declaration:

Declare your medical cannabis at customs when leaving France to avoid any legal issues.


